



Robin Brasso. An experienced educator and advocate for equality in education, Robin Brasso holds B.A. in English Literature, M.A. in Learning Handicapped, Standard Teaching Credential K-14, Resource Special Credential, and Learning Handicapped Credential. She dedicated 37 years of teaching at three inner city middle schools in the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD): Portola, Ben Franklin and Potrero Hill. Robin Brasso served on the Board of United Educators of San Francisco (UESF) for 20 years, as well as on UESF's bargaining team. Currently, she serves on the Legislative Committee for UESF-Retired Division.

In addition to her impressive career in education, Robin Brasso is being recognized for her extraordinary service to the San Francisco community. She currently serves as Board member of NCJW SF, San Francisco Democratic Women in Action (SFDWIA), Democratic Women's Forum (DWF) and Raoul Wallenberg Jewish Democratic Club (RWJDC), and member of American Association of University Women (AAUW), American Jewish World Service (AJWS), Friends of the San Francisco Commission on the Status of Women, California Women Lead, Hadassah and California Alliance for Retired Americans (CARA). She dedicated many years of volunteer service working on the Board of Directors of the Anti Defamation League.
